Sup sogŭi Hosu, the Korean Language Village

- Sessions lasting one, two, or four weeks for youth ages 8-18, including high school credit sessions
- Teacher Seminars for Korean language educators
- Masters of Education in World Language Instruction



Life at *Sup sogŭi Hosu* is infused with Korean. Participants become “villagers” and live in the language and culture from the moment they wake up—participating in small language learning groups, cultural and camp activities, sports, dance, song—to the close of the day. Counselors from the United States, Canada and Korea engage with villagers and share experiences using vocabulary repetition and actions to increase understanding and retention.



Where

One site: on the shores of Turtle River Lake, northeast of Bemidji, Minn.

About Korean language and culture

Korean Language Speakers

- Worldwide: more than 78 million speakers
- Most widely spoken in both North and South Korea, but also in the former Soviet Union, the United States, Canada, Brazil and Japan.

Dialects

Generally divided according to Korea’s traditional eight provinces

The Alphabet

Han’ gul, the Korean alphabet, consists of 14 consonants and 10 basic vowels and dates back to the 15th century



Villagers have the opportunity to earn one year of high school credit in Korean by completing a four-week session.
